We are glad you have chosen CVCC to further your educational goals. This packet provides you with information to assist you with the admissions process for the Dental Hygiene program. General Information

For general information related to the profession of dental hygiene, refer to the Bureau of Labor Statistics provided by the U.S. Bureau of Labor at <http://www.bls.gov/oco/ocos097.htm>.

What is the class schedule/length for the Dental Hygiene program? The dental hygiene core courses are offered only during the **day** on a **full-time** basis. The DH program consists of seven semesters, which requires **two years to complete after all program pre-requisites are satisfied**. Graduates of the program are eligible, with the approval of the Dental Hygiene Program Director, to apply to take the National Board Dental Hygiene Examination and the CITA Clinical Examination, as well as any other state or regional Dental Hygiene Board Examinations. **Please Note: Graduates applying to take the CITA Examination will be required to undergo a criminal records check and fingerprinting prior to obtaining a NC License.**

Admission: The Dental Hygiene program begins in the Fall Semester. Admission to the program is based upon completion of **all** minimum requirements as listed on the attached “Minimum Requirements” page by the specified deadline date and the competitive selection process. To begin the admissions process, complete the CVCC Application for Admission and visit with a Counselor in Student Services.

Costs: College tuition is set by the North Carolina State Legislature and is subject to change. Dental Hygiene students are required to purchase a variety of books, class uniforms, malpractice insurance, accident insurance, and other fees as set by the College. The *approximate* cost for the Dental Hygiene program is \$6,000 (this figure reflects in-state tuition rates), plus testing and licensure fees of approximately \$2,500.00. See page 12 for additional fees.

Financial Aid: All applicants are encouraged to apply for financial aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). For information on financial aid, contact the Financial Aid Office at 828-327-7000.

Computer Access: Coursework requires ready access to the Internet and to a reliable computer with Word, PowerPoint, and Excel. Upon application to CVCC, students are assigned a CVCC email address. It is the responsibility of the student to open his/her email account and read it frequently as the College provides crucial program information through this email account. You will be notified via your CVCC email account concerning your status in the program.

DENTAL HYGIENE

Fall Semester 2012 - - Minimum Requirements

These minimum requirements must be met prior to being considered for competitive selection for the DH program.

Applicants must complete **ALL** the following requirements by **March 15, 2012** to be considered for admission for Fall Semester 2012.

1. Applicants must complete the CVCC application for admission and the application must be received in Student Services. Applications completed on-line will NOT be processed until applicant comes in and meets with a Student Services counselor prior to the requirements deadline stated above.
2. Applicants must be high school graduates or have received a GED. An official high school transcript showing the graduation date or an official copy of the GED scores must be received by CVCC. To be considered official, transcripts/GED scores must be received by the College in a sealed envelope or they will not be accepted. The high school transcript requirement is waived for applicants who have graduated from a regionally accredited two-year or four-year college.
3. Official transcripts from all previously attended colleges must be received by CVCC. To be considered official, transcripts must be received by CVCC in a sealed envelope or they will not be accepted. Grades less than C are not transferable. Transcripts will not be evaluated for transfer credit until all transcripts are received in Student Records.
4. **Applicants who do not meet curriculum exemptions must take the required Reading, Writing, and Math placement tests.** Applicants who are required to test must either place out of or complete the following courses with a minimum grade of "C" to be considered for the DH program: RED 070, 080, 090; ENG 070, 080, 090/090A; MAT 050, 060, 070. 5. **Applicants must complete or have completed ALL general education courses required in the program.** These courses include:
ENG 111 BIO 163 COM 110 CHM 130 SOC 210
ENG 114 BIO 175 PSY 150 CHM 130A
All pre-requisites must be completed by March 15 of the admission year. There can be no course grade lower than a "C" for these courses. **Please meet with the Advising Center for course planning.**
6. Applicants, who have taken coursework at CVCC or are currently enrolled in coursework at CVCC, must have a minimum cumulative (overall) grade point average of 2.50 on all CVCC coursework.
7. All applicants must "shadow" a licensed Dental Hygienist. (Min. 4 hours per day on each of 3 different days) **Please use the enclosed form to document the shadowing and return to Caroline Farmer, Director of Health Services Admissions.**

Applicants seeking readmission or transfer/AP credits for Dental hygiene classes should contact Dr. Luis Arzola, Dental Hygiene Program Director at larzola@cvcc.edu.

Applicants who complete ALL the above by the specified deadline date will then be required to take the PSB Examination for Health Occupations. The non-refundable fee for this exam is \$20. **Qualified applicants will be notified by the end of March regarding the scheduling of this exam.** (Please also see enclosed PSB Exam information sheet.)

Applicants not admitted for Fall 2012 MUST reapply in person in Student Services if they wish to be considered for the fall 2013 Dental selection.

CVCC does NOT use waiting lists for any health services program. Health program applicants must re-apply for each year they wish to be considered for admission.

Applicants must complete **ALL** admission requirements by the specified deadline. **Completion of all admission requirements is not a guarantee of acceptance.** Applicants will be notified of acceptance by May 2012.

Competitive Selection for the Dental Hygiene Program

Applicants who meet all of the minimum admission requirements shown on the previous page will be considered for admission using a competitive selection process. (Please see the enclosed sample tally sheet to see how points are assigned in each area.)

Criterion 1: Assignment of Points for all General Education Courses in the DH Program

Criterion 2: PSB Exam

(a) Students meeting minimum requirements by the specified deadline date must take the PSB Exam for Health Occupations.

(b) An applicant may take the PSB Examination once per academic year.

(c) Applicants will be notified when to take the PSB examination once all General Education Courses have been completed. Notification will be after the March 15th deadline.

(d) An applicant will be awarded points according to his/her performance on the PSB Examination. For applicants who have tested more than once, the higher score will be used.

Optional Bonus Points: Work Experience as a Certified Dental Assistant (CDA). This is not required for admission into the program. (Proof of current Certification from the Dental Assisting National Board (DANB) and evidence of employment should be sent to the address shown below. Work experience prior to obtaining DANB certification **will not** be considered.)

The Dental Hygiene program expects to accept 18 applicants.

AFTER initial acceptance, but prior to the first day of class, applicants are REQUIRED to:

Attend an orientation session with the Dental Hygiene Program Director and Faculty, at which time you will be provided with information concerning other program requirements including: Healthcare Provider CPR certification, health examination form certifying that he/she appears to be able to participate in the activities of a health profession in a clinical setting, instruments, and additional program costs.

If you are initially accepted into the Dental Hygiene program, the School of Health and Human Services will provide you with additional information on these requirements. If any of these requirements are not met, you will not be allowed to enter the DH program.

DENTAL HYGIENE PSB Information

The PSB (Psychological Services Bureau) Exam is specifically designed for those students entering education programs for health professions. The PSB Exam is comprised of a series of tests that measure abilities, knowledge, and aptitudes considered important for successful performance of students in a health program. CVCC offers two forms of the PSB Exam. **Dental Hygiene applicants take the PSB for Health Occupations.** Applicants applying for more than one medical program may be required to take two PSB exams. The PSB is a timed examination, which carries a ***non-refundable fee of \$20.*** (Fee is subject to change.) **Qualified applicants will be notified regarding the scheduling of this exam after the March 15th deadline.**

Following is the series of tests which comprise the PSB Exam:

- Academic Aptitude (verbal, arithmetic, nonverbal)
- Spelling
- Reading Comprehension
- Information in the Natural Sciences
- Vocational Adjustment Index (*scores in this area are not used in the competitive admissions process*)

Scores achieved in the areas listed above, with the exception of the Vocational Adjustment Index, are just one of the criteria used for admission into the program. **(Results are not pass/fail.)**

PSB scores are valid for three (3) years; however, a hard copy of PSB scores can only be reproduced for up to one year. If a hard copy cannot be obtained, you will need to re-take the PSB Test.

DENTAL HYGIENE

Essential Program Requirements

The following shows examples of the kind of activities a student in the Dental Hygiene program will be required to perform in order to successfully complete the program.

ISSUE	STANDARD	EXAMPLE
Occupational Exposure	The dental hygiene student may be exposed to communicable diseases, body fluids, toxic substances, latex and medicinal preparations. Students shall use appropriate precautions at all times.	Provide care, using universal precautions, for a client/patient with a communicable disease.
Communication	Written, verbal & auditory communication skills to permit effective interaction with others.	Communicate with staff members, patients and other students while wearing high filtration masks. Ascertain medical/dental history information. Monitor patient needs during treatment. Provide individualized homecare instructions.
Visual	Visual acuity sufficient to read medical information and assess dental conditions.	Annotate chart entries on paper and/or computerized medical records. Assess intraoral conditions. Interpret dental radiographs.
Mobility	Sufficient mobility to maneuver in small areas.	Access patient within confines of dental operatory and radiographic room, which involves a variety of sitting & standing positions, including bending, twisting and reaching. Access darkroom for development of radiographs.
Motor Skills	Fine and gross motor skills sufficient to perform complex psychomotor tasks.	Exploring and scaling teeth with small diameter instruments. Manipulating power-driven instruments. Placing dental radiographs.
Cognitive/Critical Thinking	Cognitive ability sufficient to recognize deviations from normal, co-diagnose, and plan treatment.	Respond quickly & appropriately to medical emergencies. Utilize assessment information to identify pathology, individualize treatment, and suggest referral when necessary.
