For core verification for transfer all grades in core courses must be C or better and overall GPA of 2.0 or higher. AA degree requires 2.0 GPA or higher. For each requirement enter the appropriate prefix, course number, and grade/hours for the class meeting that requirement. Example: HIS 122 – A/3. For students with transfer credit from NC community colleges, NC state schools, NC private schools who have signed the ICAA (listed on page 3), or any regionally accredited school enter TR as the grade. Transfer grades do **not** count in the CVCC GPA. Only these TR classes and AP (College Board) are usable for certification of the core. A **maximum of 14 hours** in the core is allowable from schools not in the CAA/ICAA. Any class on transcript, including TR from any CAA/ICAA school, can be used for degree credit. Classes in **bold** are in the CVCC catalog.
